

## **NATHAN H. WILSON ENDOWED CHAIR FOR COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP IN MINORITY AFFAIRS**

### **Purpose**

This award recognizes a faculty member who excels in contributing to the success of minority students. The actions of this faculty member directly relate to learning outcomes and retention of minority students.

### **Eligibility**

Full-time faculty on continuing contract. (No joint proposals)

### **Application Portfolio**

The application portfolio must include:

- A brief (no more than three double-spaced pages) narrative description of the candidate's accomplishments in community leadership in minority affairs. Include supporting evidence of activities in one or more of the following categories:
  - Innovation in areas such as teaching, recruitment, retention or training of minorities or programs devoted to minorities.
- Letters of support from three people who have worked with the candidate in an area relevant to minority affairs. The letters submitted will be from the following:
  - One student
  - One coworker
  - One community member
- The candidate's curriculum vitae

### **Application Submission**

Application portfolio will be submitted to the Office of the Associate Vice President of Liberal Arts annually. Specific timelines will be announced each fall semester.

### **Nominating Committee**

The nominating committee consists of faculty members appointed by the Executive Vice President for Instruction & Student Services working in cooperation with The Center for the Advancement of Teaching and Learning.

### **Award**

- \$1,000 given the year of recognition.
- For those who put forth a presentation proposal, to the National Institute for Staff and Organizational Development (NISOD) conference costs will be paid for by the College. The proposal does not have to be accepted.
- Recognition during convocation the year in which the award is given.
