

The Associate in Science (A.S.) in Radiography (FSCJ Option) degree trains and clinically prepares students to become a radiographer. What is a radiographer? A radiographer's job is to produce diagnostic medical radiographic images. The radiographers' program is a balance between theory and practice that enhances the educational experience and provides students with the skills and preparation necessary for a radiography career.

Beginning in Summer 2022, students will enter the prerequisite phase of the program (conditional offer) until they complete all admissions requirements.

Please note that admission to the professional-level Radiography courses/program is highly competitive.

COMPETITIVE REVIEW PROCESS

Students are ready for review by the admissions committee upon completion of all checklist requirements. The committee uses the Associate in Science in Radiography Ranking Criteria below to review and rank candidates for admittance consideration. Please note that the admission process is highly competitive.

Grade Point Average: Applicants must earn a grade of C or better in each prerequisite course and have an overall minimum prerequisite GPA of 2.0.

Completion of General Education coursework will allow applicants to achieve additional points.
